PARISH LEADERSHIP – PPC ELECTION NOVEMBER 29

The Pastoral Council is seeking two members for a three-year term. Any fully-initiated Roman Catholic, over the age of 16 who is registered in the parish is eligible to serve. In particular a council member must have a strong faith and a concern for the parish family. He or she must be able to listen to fellow parishioners, to work collaboratively and to build consensus.

“The Parish Pastoral Council is that basic leadership grouping called from and by the parish community to share with the Pastor the building up of the Body of Christ and to be concerned with the overall welfare of the parish family...As a consultative body, it shares with the pastor and his staff the planning and coordinating the overall policies and goals of the parish...It does not however become involved in the day-to-day details.” – Section II of the Diocesan Guidelines
